- The longer a child believes in good sorcerers and magic fairies - his life is more optimistic.

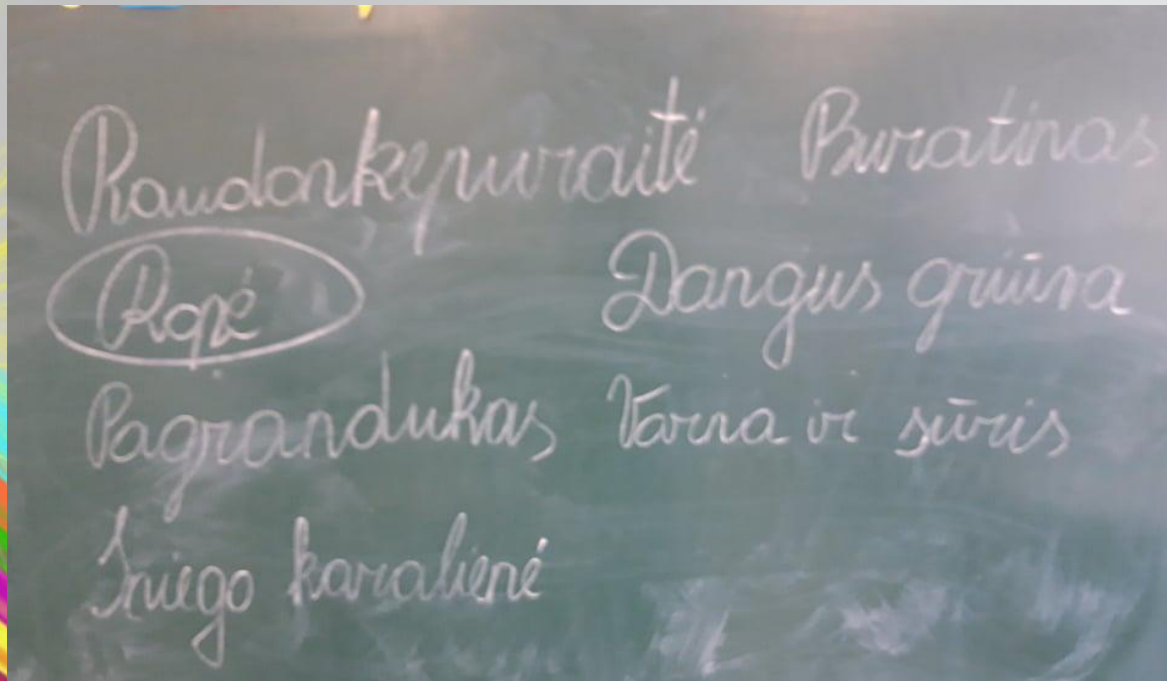
A lesson “ A fairy tale is therapy for me”
